

March Global PFD 2017 Inclusive multi-stakeholder partnerships Working groups: Methodology for facilitators and rapporteurs

Objective: Via concrete examples, understand the use and impact of multi-stakeholder partnerships in supporting the international development agenda.

Discussion groups will build on the morning panel session on multi-stakeholder partnerships, in which examples will be presented and debated.

Working groups divided up so that there is a mix of private sector, CSO, LA, governments, EU. NOTE: This will require prior division of the participant list and coding on name tags!

Methodology for PFD working groups:

All groups discuss and feedback on the same questions.

Each group chooses a facilitator and a rapporteur.

Avoid shopping list outputs; develop a concrete, value-added, coherent argument

- 1. Spend five to ten minutes reacting the panel session and whether or not the examples resonate with participants. Ask who is involved in multi-stakeholder partnerships (at any level)? (5-10 min)
- 2. What key factors determine the strength and success of multi-stakeholder partnerships (participants use post its to write down one factor per post it). These are compiled by facilitator into a master list on a flip chart. (10-15 min)
- 3. Discussion question:

What do we need to do differently (policies; expectations; skills; etc) so that multi-stakeholder partnerships best support implementation of the 2030 Agenda?

Be specific and cite examples in which PFD members are partners. (45 min)

The rapporteur takes back the answers and final outcome to the plenary (template to be provided)
