# Focus on GOAL 1: End poverty in all its forms everywhere

- 1.2 by 2030, reduce at least by half the proportion of men, women and children of all ages living in poverty → **Ind: Proportion of population below international poverty line disaggregated ..and according to national definitions**
- 1.3 implement nationally appropriate social protection systems and measures for all, including floors, and by 2030 achieve substantial coverage of the poor and the vulnerable → **Ind: Percentage of the population covered by social protection floors/systems disaggregated**

## MOI

- 1.a Ensure significant mobilization of resources including development cooperation.. adequate and predictable means for developing countries
  - **Ind: Percentage of resources allocated by the government directly to poverty reduction programmes**
  - **Ind: Spending on essential services (education, health and social protection) as % of total government spending**

# Focus on GOAL 8: inclusive and sustainable economic growth, full and productive employment and decent work for all

- 8.5 by 2030 achieve full and productive employment and decent work for all women and men...equal pay for work of equal value → **Ind: Gender wage gap**
- 8.6 by 2020 substantially reduce the proportion of youth not in employment, education or training → **Ind: Percentage of youth not in education, employment or training**
- 8.8 protect labour rights and promote safe and secure working environments of all workers... → **Ind: Frequency rates of fatal and non-fatal occupational injuries and time lost due to occupational injuries**

## MOI

- 8.b By 2020, operationalize a global strategy for youth employment and implement the Global Jobs Pact of the ILO → **Ind: Total government spending in social protection and employment programmes as % of the national budgets and GDP and collective bargaining rates**

# Focus on GOAL 10: Reduce inequality within and among countries

- 10.4 adopt policies especially fiscal, wage, and social protection policies and progressively achieve greater equality → **Ind: Labour share of GDP, comprising wages and social protection transfers.**
- 10.6 ensure enhanced representation of developing countries in decision making in global international economic and financial institutions → **Ind: Percentage of members or voting rights of developing countries in international organizations.**
- 10.7 facilitate orderly, safe, regular and responsible migration and mobility of people, including through implementation of planned and well-managed migration policies → **Ind: Recruitment cost born by employee as percentage of yearly income earned in country of destination.**

# Focus on GOAL 13: Take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts

13.2 Integrate climate change measures into national policies, strategies and planning → **Ind: Number of countries that have formally established a national adaptation plan process, national policies and measures to promote transition to environmentally-friendly substances and technologies.**

## MOI

13.b Promote mechanisms for raising capacity for effective climate change-related planning and management in least developed countries → **Ind: Number of LDCs that are receiving specialized support for mechanisms for raising capacities for effective climate change**

## Focus on GOAL 16: Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development

16.6 Develop effective, accountable and transparent institutions at all levels → **Ind: Percentage of recommendations to strengthen national anti-corruption frameworks (institutional and legislative) implemented**

16.10 ensure public access to information and protect fundamental freedoms, in accordance with national legislation and international agreements → **Ind: not retained**

### MOI

16.b Promote and enforce non-discriminatory laws and policies for sustainable development → **Ind: Percentage of population reporting having personally felt discriminated on the basis of international human rights law.**
