

## **Unions4Climate**

**In addition to signing the Unions4Climate manifesto, trade unions in Ghana commit to:**

1. Ensure government compliance with 10% renewable energy target by 2020 – and support projects that go in this sense (PV, biogas, minihydro), to sensitise workers on these policies and monitor implementation.
2. Support rural electrification through solar energy and biogas deployment, call for a skills programme and to promote the use of these technologies also in urban areas to cope with dumsor crisis through lobbying, campaigning, education and organising.
3. Reject coal plant project due to impacts on workers, environment, communities, as well as for being obsolete, and rather support use of domestic resources.
4. Mobilise to ensure law implementation and enforcement to prevent deforestation and to promote sustainable afforestation
