

SDG Progress in Asia and the Pacific

- Asia-Pacific is expected to miss the 2030 Targets by several decades as only 15% of needed progress is made
- Goal 7 and Goal 9 achieved the greatest progress
- The continued regression of Goal 13 is extremely worrying











Subregional Progress in the Implementation of the 2030 Agenda



Data availability

- Data availability remains a major problem in Asia-Pacific
 - 39% of the 247 indicators have no available data points
 - 51 of the 169 targets lack sufficient data
- There was only a 4% improvement in data availability in 2022 and a 3% improvement in 2023
- Specifically Goal 5, 14 and 16 require urgent attention to bridge the data gaps
- Public and Private investment and strong coordination between all stakeholders is needed

Focused on ending poverty in all its forms everywhere



(poverty defined as less than \$2.15 pp per day at 2017 purchasing power parity)

Revitalizing the global partnership for sustainable development to ensure no one is left behind












- Focus on food insecurity and nutritional requirements – create resilient agriculture supply chain






- Improve the resilience of poor to climate-related shocks



- Providing free legal aid for the poor








