

### The Harsh Situation of workers


#### Informal employment is high in Asia-Pacific ...





... leading to high working poverty





Share of total population in the Asia-Pacific region having gone without basic needs in the past 12 months (2017–2020)




## The impact of policies

### ... and a basic universal social protection could slash poverty




Average poverty reduction


## Policy reforms needed

#### Coverage and spending on social protection need to be increased




### Out-of-pocket expenditures must decrease en route UHC ...
