- ① Strengthening the trade union Capacities
- ② Research
- ③ Lobby and Advocacy

Strengthening Capacities

- capabilities, knowledge, and resources that EATUC need in order to be effective.
- The rededication to achieving results (Theory of Change Concept)
- Organizational capacity is multi-faceted and continually evolving.

Six components of organizational capacity

- ① governance and leadership;
- ② mission, vision, and strategy;
- ③ program delivery and impact;
- ④ strategic relationships;
- ⑤ resource development; and
- ⑥ internal operations and management.

Research

- Research based approach to trade union recommendations, positions or policy proposals on development cooperation

Lobby and Advocacy

- ① Achieve policy influence via unilateral targeted actions to decision makers
- ② Policy influence via change in general views of public and decision makers on development cooperation
