





WEBINAR: TRADE UNIONS AND THE DAC

Responses to the COVID-19 crisis call for an increased role of Official Development Assistance (ODA) to help countries weather the crisis and build an SDG centered recovery and resilience. The OECD's Development Assistance Committee's <u>reaction</u> has been timid in relation to the scale of the crisis. In this context, increased levels of ODA and a targeted approach that prioritises specific areas in line with SDG 8 will be necessary in order to support recovery and resilience processes.

In this Webinar we will look into the DAC moment and the different discussions that are taking place in the Committee, as well as how ODA is contributing to fighting inequalities and the role of taxation. We will also discuss trade union development cooperation initiatives to derive key messages to the DAC that we will put forward at the next Trade Union-DAC Forum at the end of November.
